



BROOMSTICK LACE JEWELS SCARF II



MATERIALS

4 ounces each Caron Simply Soft, medium 4, Color A-Turquoise and Color B-Pistachio or colors of your choice
 #35 (19mm) and #19 (15mm) Knitting Needle or two needles different diameters
 H 8 (5mm) Crochet hook
 Stitch markers, Scissors, Crochet needle

ADDITIONAL PATTERN INFORMATION

Stitches used: ch=chain, sc=single crochet, sl st=slip stitch, br=broomstick crochet
 Abbreviations used: BEG=beginning, ROW=row, RND=round, RS=right side, WS=wrong side, YO=yarn over

FINISHED SIZE

Approximately 58 inches by 3 1/5 inches

ABOUT BROOMSTICK LACE—It is Crochet. Developed in the 19th century, a technique using yarn, a crochet hook and a long fat “stick” or knitting needle which creates a soft lacey pattern. Because of its durability and beauty its perfect for blankets and even clothing. The circumference of the knitting needle determines the size and durability of the lace opening. You can experiment with a variety of sizes. It has also been called “Jiffy or Peacock Lace” maybe because it is so easy and quick to master!

Broomstick Lace begins on a foundation chain and is completed in 2 rows. Foundation Chain: Multiples of 3, 4, 5, 6 chains, plus 1 chain for turning.

FIRST ROW Is “Looping Up” loops onto needle: Holding the needle under your left arm, extend up the “loop” already on the crochet hook on to the needle (this is loop 1), * insert hook in next sc (either through both loops or top loop only), pick up yarn and pull through and loop onto needle, * repeat until all loops are on needle. Count loops on needle is a good idea before next step. Do not turn, keep RS facing.

SECOND ROW Is “Grouping” Loops together: Carefully slide all loops off needle. Holding loops with left hand, insert hook from right to left through the first 5 loops, yo, draw loop through the center of the five-loop group and make a ch, work 5 sc in center, * repeat until all loops have been gathered into groups of 5 to the end. The number of sc should equal the number of loops of First Row.



The pattern you choose to make can include most other crochet stitches in combinations to create many different and unique designs.



This scarf is crocheted in two pieces with a center point (Turquoise) behind the neck. This is so there is symmetry on both ends. You will also be working with two different diameters in knitting needles in 4-groups of 5 and 5-groups of 4. The beginning of the scarf is worked directly into the foundation chain rather than a sc row.

BROOMSTICK LACE JEWELS SCARF II INSTRUCTIONS

Foundation Chain: With Color A, ch 20 with crochet hook.

ROW 1: Turn, *pull up loop onto #19 (15mm) knitting needle, insert crochet hook in next ch, YO; repeat from * across. 20 loops.

ROW 2: Slide all loops off knitting needle, turn, with crochet hook pick up 5 loops, YO, draw a loop through center of group, ch 1, 5 sc in group, *insert hook in next 5 loops, draw a loop through center of group, YO, sc 5 times in group; repeat from * across, turn. 4-groups of 5.

ROW 3-10: Repeat ROW 1 from * (loops on) and ROW 2 (groups). Tie off.

ROW 11-ROW 20: Loop up Color B onto #35 (19mm) knitting needle, repeat ROW 1 from * (loops on) and ROW 2 (groups).



ROW 21-ROW 30: Repeat ROW 1 and ROW 2 but instead of 5 loop groups do 4 loop groups of 5 (this will widen the scarf from this point forward). Tie off.

OPPOSITE SIDE OF SCARF INSTRUCTIONS

With RS facing and foundation chain tail on top left, loop up Color A, (note you will be working first loops in existing sc rather than a ch) and continue ROW 1 to ROW 30 to complete opposite side.

FINISHING INSTRUCTIONS

Weave and sew in all loose ends with crochet needle.
