BEGINNER, EASY, INTERMEDIATE, EXPERIENCED

Review your crochet ability and knowledge before committing to a pattern. No crochet designer wants you to get frustrated and not start or complete their creation. You can learn any technique but it helps to know where your starting from.



BEGINNER

Basic or Beginner - You can expect basic stitches like ch, sc, dc, hdc and maybe some stitch increases and decreases. You wouldn't expect to be thrown in to changing colors quite yet.



EASY

Easy level would add what you already know in Basic/Beginner basic crochet stitches, increasing and decreasing and now add color work and simple stitch patterns.



INTERMEDIATE

Intermediate level would add what you already know in Basic/Beginner/Easy and now you are being introduced to more complex stitch patterns and/or shaping.



EXPERIENCED

Experienced or Complex projects would include maybe much more use of crochet stitches, patterns and crochet techniques and how they might work together.

Remember crochet is a skill learned by doing. Challenge yourself to learn a new crochet technique - adds to your toolbox.....that is pure joy!

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
